Green Cleaning Policy

In accordance with Connecticut Public Act 09-81

At **Andover Elementary School**, we are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for our students, staff, and community. In compliance with **Connecticut Public Act 09-81**, we have adopted a **Green Cleaning Program** to minimize exposure to potentially harmful cleaning chemicals and to promote environmental sustainability.

What is CT PA-09-81?

Connecticut Public Act 09-81 requires all public schools to implement a green cleaning program using environmentally preferable cleaning products in schools. These products must meet specific guidelines established by the **Connecticut Department of Administrative Services**, such as third-party certifications (e.g., Green Seal, ECOLOGO, or EPA Safer Choice).

Our Green Cleaning Program Includes:

- The use of environmentally preferable cleaning products for all routine cleaning of school facilities.
- Training for custodial staff on the proper use, storage, and disposal of green cleaning products.
- Periodic review and updates to our cleaning practices and products to ensure continued compliance with state guidelines.
- Safe and effective maintenance of a clean school environment without compromising indoor air quality or student health.

What You Should Know:

- Parents, guardians, and staff may not bring cleaning products into the school for general use. Only products approved by the school's green cleaning program may be used.
- Our school maintains a list of all cleaning products used, including their Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS), which is available for review by request in the school office.

Below is a chart of commonly used Betco (or Betco-compatible) environmentally preferable products, their applications, locations, and suggested schedule. Please be advised that this is a sample; the *official* product list and schedule is maintained in the school facilities operations area.

Betco pH7 Neutral Floor Cleaner	Daily floor cleaning, removing dirt/grime	Classrooms, hallways, multipurpose rooms, corridors	Daily (or as needed)
Betco Clear Image Glass & Surface Cleaner	Glass / mirror / hard surface wiping	Windows, mirrors, glass doors, whiteboards, glass partitions	Daily
Betco Spectaculoso All-Purpose Cleaner	General purpose cleaning & deodorizing	Desks, countertops, lockers, walls, plastic/laminate surfaces	Daily or as needed
Betco Green Earth Peroxide Cleaner	All-purpose / peroxide-based cleaner	Bathrooms, showers, tile, general hard surfaces	Daily (or in rotation)
Betco pH7Q Dual Neutral Disinfectant Cleaner	Disinfecting + cleaning (where antimicrobial is allowed)		Daily or as needed (when disinfecting is required)
Betco AF79 Acid-Free Restroom Cleaner	Restroom cleaning / disinfecting	Toilets, urinals, bathroom partitions, tile walls	Daily
Betco Speedex Degreaser / Heavy Duty Cleaner	Grease / heavy soil removal	Kitchen, custodial rooms, food preparation areas	Weekly or more often as needed
Betco FiberPro Spot / Stain Remover	Spot cleaning on carpets, upholstery	Classroom carpets, library carpet, fabric seating	As needed (spot)
